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
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
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
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FIVE DAY FACULTY DEVELOPMENT PROGRAM ON EFFECTIVE TOOLS IN PHARMACY PRACTICE




Fig. 2: Presentation on Drug design research: Molecular Modelling

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

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


Fig. 1: Presentation on Drafting of research and review paper for indexed journals

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


Fig. 1: Presentation on Research methodology: Method and techniques




Fig. 2: Presentation on Research methodology: Method and techniques
